# <u>Oral Awards – Undergraduate, Veterinary & Graduate Student Category:</u>

- 1st place Marta Muñoz Baquero: Marta is from Universidad de Murcia & Universidad Politécnica de Valencia; Marta presented a talk entitled, "Comparison of Semen Parameters in Small-spotted Catshark (Scyliorhinus canicula): Wild versus Aquarium-Housed Animals" as part of her current PhD work.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> place (tied) Sarah Wahltinez & Bryce Talsma:

# **EDUCATON AND CAREER OPPORTUNITIES**

#### 1. VETERINARY INTERNSHIP - MYSTIC AQUARIUM

The Department of Animal Care at Mystic Aquarium, a division of Sea Research Foundation, is offering graduate veterinarians looking to specialize in aquatic animal medicine an Internship in Aquatic Animal Medicine and Research. Applicants for the internship should be graduates of an AVMA accredited veterinary college or ECFVG certified. This internship is being offered to occur from hire through June 2022; or could be arranged to extend through June 30, 2023, depending on the plans of the successful candidate. \*\*See IAAAM website for application details.

#### 2. AQUAVET 2022

We are pleased to announce the AQUAVET® 2022 courses and related information.

AQUAVET® I and II will be presented at Roger Williams University in Bristol, Rhode Island. Bristol is a picture-perfect New England town about 20 minutes from Newport.

# AQUAVET® I - An Introduction to Aquatic Veterinary Medicine

The course is designed for veterinary students and veterinarians who have an interest in applying their veterinary training to aquatic animals.

Duration: 4 weeks – May 29 to June 25, 2022

Fee: \$2,525 for full-time veterinary students, although a program benefactor will pay \$200 for each student, bringing the cost down to \$2,325. This includes tuition, room and most meals.

#### **AQUAVET**° II – Comparative Pathology of Aquatic Animals

The course is oriented toward the pathology of vertebrates and invertebrates commonly used as laboratory animals, encountered in display aquaria, and of importance to aquaculture enterprises.

Duration: 2 weeks – May 29 to June 11, 2022 – Prerequisite: AQUAVET I

Fee: \$1,515 for full-time veterinary students. This includes tuition, room and most meals.

#### AQUAVET® Summer Research Fellow (one offered)

Fellows pay no tuition for the 8 weeks of the research program itself and will be reimbursed for room and board expenses. In addition, research student will receive a stipend of \$3,800 for the research period.

Duration: 8 weeks following AQUAVET® I - Prerequisite: AQUAVET® I

Venue: Laboratory at Cornell University

Applications for admission are due by <u>January 15, 2022</u>. The application is available on our website. You will receive an e-mail acknowledging receipt of your completed application and supporting materials.

#### 3. <u>VETERINARY TECHNICIAN/ REGISTRAR – SEATTLE AQUARIUM</u>

The Seattle Aquarium is looking for a licensed veterinary technician with clinical and registrar responsibilities. Registrar duties include assisting with the Aquarium's animal record system (Tracks) and animal acquisitions and dispositions. This is a full-time hourly position reporting to the senior veterinarian. This position will be working within the Aquarium's Life Sciences department, which maintains a staff of 28 full-time and part-time employees caring for sea otters, harbor seals, northern fur seals, river otters, alcids and shorebirds, temperate and tropical fish and invertebrates, and occasionally sea turtles in rehabilitation. The veterinary team consists of one full-time senior veterinarian and two relief veterinarians, with assistance from the husbandry teams.

# 4. VETERINARIAN – SÉPAQ AQUARIUM du QUÉBEC

You are the veterinarian in charge of conducting exams and designing and administering veterinary treatments and care to screen, prevent, diagnose, and treat disease in all animals at the aquarium. You are responsible for overseeing teams of laboratory technicians and animal health technicians. You are responsible for managing the department's budgets. You are expected to collaborate with those responsible for Aquarium du Québec's animal welfare and ethics programs and with external partners. Your responsibilities include Aquarium du Québec's entire animal collection. \*\*See IAAAM website for application details.

# 5. <u>VETERINARY TECHNICIAN – MISSISSIPPI AQUARIUM</u>

The veterinary technician is responsible for supporting the veterinary services department to provide health care for the entire collection of animals at Mississippi Aquarium. It is essential that the technician be able to work independently, efficiently, and collaborate with all other departments at the aquarium. The ideal candidate will represent Mississippi Aquarium in a positive light and be enthusiastic and committed to all aspects of the job. \*\*See IAAAM website for application details.

#### 6. VETERINARY PRECEPTORSHIP/ EXTERNSHIP - MISSISSIPPI AQUARIUM

Mississippi Aquarium (MSAQ) provides veterinary students the unique opportunity to gain experience in the field of aquatic animal medicine. Preceptorships/externships lasting a minimum of 4 weeks and a maximum of 6 weeks are available.
