Diagnostic Imaging of Marine Mammals

The radiology workshop will be a two part program. One part will focus on hands-on ultrasound and radiography with the objectives to demonstrate abdominal ultrasound and positioning for radiography of pinnipeds. The other part will consist of lectures and case studies to include modality choice, application and limitations of modalities, normal anatomy of cetaceans and pinnipeds on imaging, and examples of cases demonstrating the use of modalities. 8th Annual CL Davis Marine Species Histopathology Workshop

The 8th annual CL Davis DVM Foundation Marine Species Histopathology Workshop will be held in conjunction with the IAAAM conference in Sausalito, California this year.

This workshop will include a keynote lecture by Dr. Melissa Miller, a wildlife pathologist at the Marine Wildlife Veterinary Care and Research Center in Santa Cruz. Dr. Miller will present

important disease concerns of Sea Otters (*Enhydra lutrea*). The rest of the day includes interactive presentations of clinical cases with pathology including histology. Workshop participants are encouraged to submit a case for presentation – but presentation is not required. Come and discuss some of the important questions in aquatic animal pathology. We welcome cases related to invertebrates, fishes, aquatic birds, and marine mammals.

All participants receive DVDs of the scanned histology slides and the case write up materials. Workshop registration includes materials, morning and afternoon breaks <u>***as well as lunch!***</u> All IAAAM members are invited to attend. Registration is limited to 50 participants and cost per person is only \$100.

UPCOMING EVENTS

"Health and Colony Management of Laboratory Fish" at Mount Desert Island Biological Laboratory Bar Harbor, Maine – 19 – 23 August 2013.

Applications are being accepted for this 1-week educational opportunity for individuals with maintenance, management or research responsibilities in which fish are used as laboratory animals. APPLICATION DEADLINE IS JUNE 15, 2013.

The course is offered at the Mount Desert Island Biological Laboratory, Salisbury Cove, Maine during the period of 19 - 23 August 2013. Topics to be discussed will include general system design and water quality management, anatomy and histology of fish, general fish diseases and disease management strategies. Infectious and non-infectious diseases common to all fish as well as specific diseases of importance to laboratory-maintained zebrafish will be discussed. The course will consist of lecture, laboratory exercises and discussions. During the course there will be an opportunity for students to discuss unusual and/or unsolved diagnostic case experiences from their home laboratories as problem-solving exercises. The course should be particularly valuable to technical staff, graduate students, postdoctoral fellows, junior faculty and investigators needing skills to monitor the health of a colony of aquatic organisms. New IAAAM Website

As many of you have already noticed, the IAAAM website has recently changed. After an evaluation of the company that previously provided our web services, the IAAAM board and I decided that we needed to change hosting companies and began discussing various options for the new website. The recommendation which was approved by the board focused on simplifying web services and reducing costs. We decided to use a web hosting company which focuses on websites only, contract out conference web management, and use third parties for an online payment system and email. We have seen a reduction in overall cost of web services and are now using more reliable web service companies.

In order to facilitate these changes, we have switched from a database-driven to a content-driven website. This means a few of the previous services are no longer available. There is not a "member's only" section on the new website, but the content that is posted on the website including the job bank, educational opportunities and other news items, will be available to everyone. Also no longer available are the member's directory and check status feature. If you are needing to contact other members and do not have their contact information, drop us a note in the Contact Us area of the website and we will pass the message along.
