Happy October IAAAM Members!

We hope everyone is excited as we are for IAAAM's 54th annual conference in Galway, Ireland May 19-23, 2024!! Those dates may look slightly different than previously reported. We needed to shift the conference by just one day, so please make sure to update your calendars for finalizing travel and hotel stay.

We are also excited to share the official website for the conference! Current updates on the website include:

A few details regarding abstract submission and pre-conference workshop proposals are below; however, keep an eye out for further updates via email blasts, newsletters, and the website directly.

All abstracts must be submitted on-line **before Midnight EST (GMT-5) on December 1, 2023.**ALL aspects of aquatic animal health and medicine will be considered; however, the following topics are encouraged for the 2024 conference:

- One Health: presentations that focus on the links between aquatic environmental, animal, and human health
- Fish, Invertebrate and Amphibian health and sustainability, including aquaculture, reproduction, and conservation practices
- Imaging: presentations that use imaging for diagnosis, monitoring, therapeutics and more
- Novel techniques and Innovation: presentations that highlight innovative methodology and treatments in aquatic animal medicine
- Conservation Medicine: presentations that highlight veterinary and zoological expertise being leveraged to benefit any wild aquatic animal species and ecosystem

Those interested in coordinating a workshop must submit a proposal using the online portal that is set to open **October 23rd**. The deadline to submit is Friday, **December 1st**. Although the conference will be offered hybrid, due to trying to keep the workshop fee affordable to attendees, workshops will only be available in person.

Call for Student Travel Award Applications

The IAAAM Executive Board will again be granting monetary awards to students planning to deliver ORAL presentations at the annual IAAAM conference in May 2024. The awards are intended to defray costs of attending the conference, promote student participation in the professional program and further the commitment of the IAAAM to its students. The formal program will extend from May 19th – 23rd, 2024. Awards will be granted on a competitive basis, with the goal of supporting as many students as possible. Undergraduate students, Masters and PhD students, veterinary students, veterinary interns/residents/fellows, and postdocs are eligible. The requirements for all applicants include the following:

- A cover letter that describes the future plans of the applicant with regard to aquatic animal medicine.
- An abstract of the paper to be presented. This abstract must not exceed 500 words in length. Only abstracts will be considered. Abstracts must follow guidelines available on the IAAAM conference website: https://cvent.me/WPBx1L
- Curriculum vitae and two (2) letters of recommendation, one of which must be from an active member of the IAAAM.
- 4. A budget that details how financial support will be helpful.
- 5. Student presenters must be an active member (with dues paid up-to-date) of the IAAAM, OR the student must provide a third, separate letter from the student's institution verifying student, intern/resident/fellow, or postdoc status. Students are highly encouraged to become active members of the IAAAM prior to applying. Student members are entitled to a lower conference registration rate than non-members.

The Education Member of the IAAAM Executive Board and representatives from the Student Liaison Committee will review the applications. Applicants will be ranked according to judgment criteria that will include: the quality of the written abstract (500 words or less), the justification/significance of the work, the complexity of the work relative to the student's academic achievements, and the commitment of the student to aquatic animal medicine. The intent of the Student Liaison Committee and the Executive Board is to fund as many students as possible. We anticipate that awardees will receive monetary stipend, similar to previous years. The rankings will be determined from the entire pool of applicants; separate awards for different academic classes of applicants (i.e. undergraduate, graduate, veterinary residents) will not be offered. Up to one additional travel award may be designated for additional areas as follows: 1) a deserving international applicant and/or 2) a student whose research demonstrates advancements and/or commitment to the application of diagnostic imaging within the field.

^{**}The deadline for receipt of complete application packets will be **Friday, December 1, 2023.**** Applications received after the deadline will not be considered. Recipients will be contacted on or around February 1, 2024. Students submitting abstracts for the travel award competition must still separately submit their presentation abstract for acceptance into the conference proceedings. The IAAAM Treasurer will be notified and will send checks to the successful applicants.

Emailed applications will be accepted and are highly encouraged, though portions, such as letters of recommendation, may still be submitted by regular mail.
